

2024/25 GUIDELINES FOR NEW ADVANCED TRAINEE APPLICANTS to the VPMTP

The following guidelines are for the benefit of applicants, palliative care services and the members of the interviewing panels.

This document is intended for new Advanced Trainee and interstate ongoing Advanced Trainee applicants only. All other applicants please disregard this document and refer to the 2024 Guidelines for Applicants to the VPMTP document.

BACKGROUND

Following a review of the VPMTP annual interview and matching process in 2023, we have made a number of changes which affects all new Advanced Trainee applicants for the 2024/25 academic year.

The VPMTP aims to provide a breadth of high quality of specialist training across a variety of different training environments. With this in mind, the VPMTP has redeveloped the interview and allocation process. We are committed to providing trainees with positions across a broad range of services and locations, tailored to individual training needs. Information regarding your preferences will be discussed during the interview process.

The redeveloped process commences this year for new Advanced Trainees (ongoing Advanced Trainees will continue in the existing process).

All new Advanced Trainees should expect that they will be placed at a rural or regional service for six months during their two years of core training.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications for VPMTP Registrar positions are accepted via the VPMTP website – click Apply Now.

By applying to be interviewed by VPMTP, you agree to accept the position offered to you as a result of this process.

Should you encounter any issues with the online application process, please email all queries to the VPMTP via vpmtp@svha.org.au.

The combination of your submitted application form, cover letter and CV will be assessed to determine your suitability for an Entry Interview.

- Cover letters should be kept to a maximum of one page
- CVs should be kept to a maximum of four pages.

Please note the application form includes a question regarding a VPMTP part time supernumerary position. If you would like to be considered for this position, please answer 'yes' to this question (*refer to page 3 for more information*).



ENTRY INTERVIEW PROCESS FOR NEW VPMTP ADVANCED TRAINEES

New Advanced Trainee applicants will be invited to attend an Entry Interview, to be held online.

All applicants will be notified approximately one week prior to their interview as to the date and time.

Format of interview

- All Entry Interviews will be held online.
- You will be asked a series of questions by a panel of three to four palliative care consultants.
- A communication skills role play with an actor will be an assessed component of the interview.

Interview scoring

- Candidates' responses will be marked, however these scores will not be ranked against other applicants.
- Scores will be retained for subsequent benchmarking and analysis.
- Referee evaluations do not contribute to your final interview score.

Applicants will be scheduled for an interview on one of the following dates:

• Tuesday 15 August 2023; Wednesday 16 August 2023; Thursday 17 August 2023.

ALLOCATION PROCESS

The order of allocations is as follows:

- 1. Ongoing Advanced Trainees
- 2. New Advanced Trainees and six-month stand-alone registrars.

Positions for ongoing Advanced Trainees for 2024 will be allocated according to training requirements, considering the ranking at interview and position preferences.

New Advanced Trainees for 2024 will be allocated to remaining positions based on training needs and preferences discussed during the interview. In their second and third years of Advanced Training, these trainees will be allocated positions following an Annual Training Discussion to determine their ongoing training requirements.

Successful Six-month stand-alone registrar applicants will be allocated positions considering their performance at interview and their position preferences.

Fellowship and Paediatric candidates are allocated separately.

The community positions at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre, Melbourne City Mission, Werribee Mercy and one position at Barwon Geelong are funded by the RACP organised STP scheme. It is a requirement of the STP scheme that only RACP Advanced Trainees be appointed to these positions.

APPLICATION OUTCOME

Applicants will be notified of their position allocation within approximately seven days after the interview period concludes.



Within one business day of receipt of the offer, the applicant **MUST** email the VPMTP (<u>vpmtp@svha.org.au</u>) with their response to accept or reject the job offer.

Services will then be informed of their allocated trainee/s within three working days of the confirmed allocation by VPMTP.

It is the applicant's responsibility to contact their allocated service director to confirm their intention to accept the position. This must be done MORE THAN five working days after notifying the VPMTP of their acceptance. This timing is to ensure the services have been informed of allocation by VPMTP prior to trainee contact.

The service will then make the necessary arrangements for you to be employed by sending a written offer followed by a formal contract of employment.

If you decide to withdraw from the position after your initial acceptance, you should notify the service director **and** the VPMTP Medical Training Coordinator as soon as possible. This will allow the position to be offered to another applicant.

PART TIME SUPERNUMERARY REGISTRAR POSITION

Background

The VPMTP is committed to developing opportunities for part time training, and annually accepts applications for one **part time supernumerary registrar position**. This VPMTP funding is available to support part time work as an Advanced Trainee or six-month registrar (and not working as part of a job-share arrangement). The funding for this position is not intended to be used in tandem with a second part time position.

Candidates who would like to be considered for part time supernumerary funding will be interviewed on the same day as their appropriate cohort. All candidates will be considered, and a decision made at the conclusion of interviews. Those who are unsuccessful will be allocated to a full-time position if this has been declared on their application.

The successful candidate will secure funding for a 12-month (0.5 FTE) part time position. The registrar will be able to select their preferred job from a pool of positions at various Victorian palliative care services. The available positions will be disseminated to applicants for consideration. (Please note that there are no part time paediatric palliative care registrar positions available).

How to apply

As part of your application for Advanced Training or six-month registrar, a question will ask if you would like to apply for part time supernumerary position - select **Yes** to this question.

It is important to note that there is only funding for one position. Please also indicate if you would like to be considered for a full-time position if unsuccessful in the part time position application.

In your cover letter, please also include an explanation to support your application. This should address why you prefer to work in a part-time capacity.



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- The College requires trainees to undertake their core training in more than one service and this will be one of the conditions to be met in allocation of trainees.
- There are rural and regional positions available through the VPMTP and trainees will be allocated to these services.
- If problems arise during the semester for whatever reason, trainees should initially contact their current clinical supervisor, clinical service director, or mentor if they have one. VPMTP would be happy to discuss any concerns further to this.
